

STK Young Scientist Award

Regulations

1. Conditions

The STK society supports and fosters young scientists engaged in research in the fields of calorimetry and thermal analysis. For this purpose, the STK Young Scientist Award has been introduced in 1994. The awardees are under 40 years of age, and are selected for their remarkable recent contributions/publications. In accordance with the statutes of our Society (Art. 27), the regulations of this award are specified in the present document. The awardee must present his work at the annual STK meeting, in the form of an oral contribution. The award will only be awarded in presence of the awardee.

2. Committee

The STK Young Scientist Award Committee is responsible for the attribution of the Award, and decides upon agreement on the proposed curriculum vitae and list of publications of the candidate. The Committee consists in the President of the STK, and one to three additional members of the STK Board. If one member of the Committee cannot serve due to a Conflict of Interest, the remaining members shall decide.

3. Amount

The Award consists in 1'200 CHF in cash, accompanied by a framed certificate signed by the Young Scientist Award Committee members. The awardee receives his award at the STK annual meeting, just before giving his talk.

4. Procedure

Candidates can either apply directly, or be proposed by a member of the STK. In both cases, they have to send, electronically and with a letter of recommendation, the curriculum vitae and the list of publications of the candidate to the President of STK. Applications can be sent anytime: the Committee will consider them, decide if the candidate shall receive the award, and when (year). The candidate that has been selected for the award at the next STK annual meeting will be personally contacted by the President of STK. Non-selected candidates will be informed. The decisions of the Committee are final and cannot be appealed.
